Trust and Obey

Several years ago, I read Bob Roberts, Jr.'s book *Transformation* where he writes, "For some strange reason today, instead of being a power source, prayer is the excuse for not doing anything, always 'waiting on God' to do something, but it never happens. 'Wait' always wants more information..." (Page 131).

In a similar vein, Martin Luther King, Jr. in his Sermon "The Misuse of Prayer," states, "Although prayer is native to man, there is the danger that he will misuse it. Although it is a natural outpouring of his spirit, there is the danger that he will use it in an unnatural way." King goes on in his sermon to mention that one of the ways we misuse prayer is that we "make prayer a substitute for work."

In Exodus 14:14 we read, "The Lord will fight for you, you need only keep still." This seems an invitation for us to "wait for the Lord," which in many ways it is. Yet just one verse later the Lord speaks to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the people to get moving! Pick up your staff and raise your hand over the sea. Divide the water so the Israelites can walk through the middle of the sea on dry ground" (vs. 15-16).

In prayer we trust the situation, struggle, request, etc. to the Lord with the mind of preparation to be obedient when God tells us to move. The hymn *Trust and Obey* comes to my mind when the chorus proclaims,

Trust and obey, for there's no other way
To be happy in Jesus, but to trust and obey.

We are made for prayer and prayer is made for us. We need to find the balance of praying without acting and praying while acting. God calls us in prayer to wait upon Him, while being prepared to move when He tells us to move.

Prayer: Lord, I wrestle with finding balance between activity and waiting. I need your balance in my life. I want to spend time in the waiting of prayer, while being active when you call me to move. Help me, Lord! I love you. I want to Trust and Obey. In Jesus' name I pray. Amen.

Flood Recovery Trip

On March 12-18, Living the Adventure Ministries is leading a team to Eastern Kentucky to assist in the ongoing recovery following the torrential rains that flooded the area in July 2022. You are invited to participate in this team. We are still looking for people who feel called to serve on a mission team. This domestic opportunity is our response to God's call on Living the Adventure Ministries to be a domestic and international mission ministry.

We will leave Sunday afternoon and travel to Eastern Kentucky where we will be staying in a church's Family Life Center. We will work Monday-Friday and return home on Saturday. Our accommodations during the trip will be sleeping on air mattresses in the Family Life Center. There are bathrooms and a shower house at the church. We will prepare our meals in the Family Life Center. We will have work available to us in the areas of construction, painting, cleaning out, sorting materials, and working in the local mission store. We could also use people who would serve as cooks for our team.

As I look back over my life, I realize time and again how God placed me in certain positions to teach me and prepare me for future leadership. In 2003, when I made my first mission trip experience, I could not understand how God would use the next 20-years to establish an international mission ministry. Yet, over the past 20-years, I have led 41 mission trips domestically and internationally and in 2023, I have four trips already scheduled.

Earlier in the Adventure Journal you read about the upcoming trip to Eastern Kentucky. This year, I will also be leading a team to Guyana, South America on July 27-August 6. The focus of our trip will be to continue to expand our relationship with the Caribbean Methodist Church in Guyana, while leading an Arts Camp for children and youth. The Arts Camp will serve as an opportunity for us to engage students in an area of study that taps into their creative side. We will teach art skills, while sharing the Gospel with the students in attendance. The Art Show at the end of the week will seek to engage the parents and community where once again the Gospel will be shared. There will be opportunities for other areas of service throughout the week for the team, as we work with the local church to discover projects in the community and in the local church.
