Pleasing to God

In John 21 we read about Jesus asking Peter three times, "Do you love me?". After Peter has responded to these questions, we read, "Peter turned around and saw behind them the disciple Jesus loved—the one who had leaned over to Jesus during supper and asked, 'Lord, who will betray you?' Peter asked Jesus, 'What about him, Lord?' Jesus replied, 'If I want him to remain alive until I return, what is that to you? As for you, follow me'" (vv. 20-22).

During a highlight moment in Peter's relationship with Jesus, it would seem Peter's vision for Jesus' call on his life to "feed my sheep" would be the focus for his attention. Yet, Peter loses his focus and Jesus must bring him back to what is most important.

In an earlier experience, Peter walked on water in Matthew 14:22-31. He did well until the wind and waves grabbed his attention and he began to sink. He lost his focus on Jesus. He cried out, "Lord, save me." Jesus grabbed him and said, "You have so little faith. Why did you doubt me?"

On both of these occasions, Peter took his focus off Jesus and Jesus' call on his life. Jesus invited Peter to walk out on the water and Jesus called for Peter to "feed my sheep." The vision was firmly placed in front of Peter, but the worries of the world or his struggle with comparison became a distraction. He was more worried about the wind and the waves and how other people's lives would be lived than he was on focusing on Jesus.

Over the past few weeks, the Holy Spirit has been speaking into my heart about the struggles of losing my focus on Jesus, especially in matters of comparison. I find myself at times falling into the trap of wishing for the experience someone else is having or wondering if I am enough.

As I was journaling on this topic recently, I was drawn to 1 Thessalonians 2:4, 6. "For we speak as messengers approved by God to be entrusted with the Good News. Our purpose is to please God, not people. He alone examines the motives of our hearts...As for human praise, we have never sought it from you or anyone else."

As we continue in our Lenten Journey, we need to ask the Holy Spirit to focus us on Jesus' invitation to "follow me." It may be easy to become distracted with the winds and the waves or with the looking around at other Christians and their experiences. Let me invite you to "turn your eyes upon Jesus" as we move toward Holy Week and the celebration of Easter. May everything you say and do be for the glory of God and not the glory of anyone else.

Guyana Trip—Deadline

We are working on finalizing our team to Guyana for our trip July 27-August 5. The trip will feature an Art Camp for children and youth, an opportunity for ministry to adults, and possibly some construction (depending on the skill level of the team). Each person on the team is required to have a valid Passport and up-to-date inoculations (including a few not required for public schools). We will finalize our living accommodations once we have the total number of team members. The cost for the trip is \$2300 per person, which includes lodging, food, flight, in-country transportation, and project costs. Tourism and Discipleship

In the last *Adventure Journal*, I wrote an article entitled: "Making Disciples." In the article I wrote, "In 2023, I seek to focus more on discipleship in obedience to God's call to use the platforms He has given to me to share His love, mercy, and grace, while inviting people to live the Kingdom of God way of life." The platforms include proclamation/speaking, writing, mission teams, and discipleship adventures. The India Trip serves as a discipleship adventure. The trip includes tourism to some of the greatest sites of North India, including the Taj Mahal, a rickshaw ride through Old Delhi, a Maharaja palace, the Amber Fort, etc. There is an opportunity to view and purchase some of the beautiful crafts and creations of the various Indian artisans.

On the second leg of the trip, we will focus on the ministry of Brother E. Stanley Jones who served with his wife and daughter as missionaries to India in the 20th Century. We will see some of his legacy along with other Methodist Missionaries' legacies still actively in ministry through the Nurmanzil Psychiatric Center, Warne Baby Fold, Isabel Thoburn College, etc. We will then travel to the Sat Tal Christian Ashram where we will experience the week-long Winter Christian Ashram, a discipleship retreat of getting away from work to experience the Kingdom of God in miniature with our Indian brothers and sisters. During the Sat Tal Christian Ashram, there will be opportunity in the afternoon to travel to Nanital, a resort town with wonderful shops and wonderful views. We will wrap up the trip with a Jungle Safari at the Corbett National Park before returning to Delhi for departure.

This once in a lifetime trip is a beautiful balance of tourism and discipleship as we witness the beauty of God's creation, experience the power of the Holy Spirit, and are introduced to a different culture and hear their stories of faith. I would enjoy having you travel with us on this trip. The trip is September 25-October 12 and the cost is about \$3200, not including your flight. The cost may go down as our agreement with the tourism company includes incentives for more people traveling with us.

God Opens Doors

During the Covid pandemic, I was introduced through a mutual acquaintance to Brother John Chirwa, a church leader in Malawi, Africa. John and I spoke a few times via WhatsApp about the Christian Ashram and about training pastors. We looked forward to a time when I could travel to Malawi to introduce the Christian Ashram and to speak to church leaders and pastors.

As Covid restrictions started to ease and my schedule picked up again, the thoughts of going to Malawi were placed on the proverbial "back burner." On January 10, I received the following message from Brother John: "We are putting together 500 leaders from different churches

I will be working with Brother John in seminar ministry, evangelistic ministry, and sharing the Christian Ashram with local pastors. I look forward to how God will use this opportunity. Please pray for me as I finalize travel documents (my flights are already purchased) and physically prepare for the trip, as it will be part of a four continent across three and half-months travels.
