Pure Heart

Gaining access to someone who is famous can be a lot of work. Whether it is purchasing a backstage pass for a famous singer or going through the process of background checks and applications to visit a world-leader, work must be done. If the access is granted, we spend time in preparations to assure we have the book or the shirt we might want autographed. We pick out what we will wear, which may require a shopping trip to get the right clothes. The day of the meeting, we spend time primping and prepping so we can look our best. We look our best in hopes of making an impression on the famous person or leader.

In some ways, this same pursuit summarizes the way we come to "see Jesus." There is a lot of work as we try to do more in hopes of gaining an audience. We believe we have to go to the right place (church/camp/retreat) or we have to wear the correct clothes or we have to give the right amount of money. We pursue God with our minds and with our stuff, yet we miss the importance and supremacy of our heart.

In Matthew 5:8 Jesus says, "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God." The answer to "see God" is not the actions we take as much as the transformation of our heart and the surrender of our lives to seek holiness and righteousness. The author of Hebrews picks up on this same sentiment in Hebrews 12:14, "Pursue peace with everyone, and the holiness without which one will see the Lord."

In Psalm 24:4-6, the Psalmist writes, "Those who have clean hands and pure hearts, who do not lift up their souls to what is false, and do not swear deceitfully. They will receive blessing from the Lord, and vindication from the God of their salvation. Such is the company of those who seek him, who seek the face of the God of Jacob." The pure heart seeks the Lord with her whole being and desire. The pure heart is transformed and made new. From this transformation the desire to see the Lord leads us to the places where we experience the power of God. Whether that is sitting in quiet devotion or vibrant worship; whether in a small group Bible Study or the music festival. When our hearts are pure and seeking the Lord, we see the Lord. Is your heart pure? Are you trying to see the Lord, only to realize the actions you take are not the beginning but it is the pure heart?

Prayer: Lord, purify my heart. I want to see you as I move about in my day. When I am quiet in your presence and when I am standing with others in worship to you. Guyana Ministry

The Methodist Church has a deep history and tradition within Guyana. According to the Guyana Methodist District website:

The British Methodist Church came to Guyana (British Guiana) in 1802, when two lay persons, freed slaves, William Claxton and William Powell, came from Nevis in the British West Indies and began preaching the Gospel in the capital city of Georgetown.

The first Methodist Minister to arrive in the country was John Hackshaw, sent from England by Dr Thomas Coke in 1805. He was immediately deported by the then Governor Beaujon for fear that he would preach, convert, organize and educate both slaves and ex-slaves. It was not until 1814 that a British Minister was finally allowed to return.

Methodism in Guyana continued under the British Methodist Church until 1967, when the autonomous Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas (MCCA) was established.

The Methodist Church in the Caribbean and the Americas (MCCA) includes Guyana, Jamaica, Bahamas, Turks & Caicos Islands, Belize, Honduras, Leeward Islands, Panama, Costa Rica, Haiti, and the South Caribbean. We have worked with the MCCA since 2010 when we first traveled to Haiti. We are pleased to continue our partnership with the MCCA as we travel to Guyana on June 24-July 2. Our team consists of three people (Matt, Judah, and Isaiah).

We will be working in the Mahaica Circuit, which consists of eight churches who will gather in one worship experience on June 30 as we celebrate Home and Family Sunday. As part of the day, the team will speak about Mental Health and Suicide Prevention. Guyana has one of the highest per capita suicide rates in the world. It seems the heritage of Jonestown and the Jim Jones Peoples Temple massacre continues to live on in the country. It is our hope to have open conversations with the congregation about the importance of mental health awareness, counseling, and support, while learning about the daily struggles leading to the high suicide rate.

Matt will be meeting with church leaders to discuss church renewal, revival, discipleship, and evangelism. According to *Operation World*, Guyana is 52.7% Christian and 18% of the country is unevangelized. The second largest religion is Hinduism, followed by Islam. There is a great need for the Gospel to be proclaimed and the Kingdom of God experienced in Guyana.

The team will also be working with some of the local churches on minor repair and construction projects. We are finalizing the budget and hope to have a clear project
